Unit Content

Outcomes

1. Explain the relationship between the Bible as a unified narrative and theology, and appreciate the variety of different approaches to theology and the potential influence each may have on education.
2. Summarise the major concerns of hermeneutics and methods of interpreting the Bible, including concerns regarding epistemological approaches to the Bible as God's written word.
3. Discuss the themes of Scripture and their pertinence to schooling.

4. Compare and contrast the literature genres of specific books, and see the history of the Old and New Testament Scriptures in terms of the larger plans and purposes of God—with specific reference to education;
5. Evaluate the implications of a biblically grounded metanarrative for life and educational practice.

Subject Content

1. An Introduction to postgraduate study
2. Revelation, inspiration, authority, and education
3. Understanding Christian history
4. Hermeneutics, epistemology, Christian anthropology, theology and education
5. A history of kingship and authority
6. The centre-piece of the Gospel message and implications for education today
7. The mission of those embedded in God's story
8. Hope: A seeking of the restoration of 'all things'
9. Bible narrative and biblical metanarrative as an alternate 'story' education
