Outcomes

- 1. Critically appraise the approaches taken by curriculum developers, and the role of teachers in creating, planning, reviewing and adapting units of curriculum in Christian schools for use with their classes;
- 2. Critique various theories and practices associated with curriculum design and development, assessing their alignment with a biblical perspective;

- 3. Describe and discuss the advantages and challenges of collegial curriculum development practice with reference to an action research investigation;
- 4. Recommend processes and strategies for ongoing collaborative development of curriculum in Christian schools, which reflects a school's student characteristics, faith commitments, and vision in a dynamically structure and Biblically informed approach.

Subject Content

- 1. Understanding the nature of curriculum: Overview of definitions and development of curriculum as a concept
- 2. Deciding what will be taught, and how in Christian schools: The place of curricula in the Christian teacher's classroom practice
- 3. Evaluating curriculum: A biblical basis for understanding criteria for evaluating and reviewing curricula
- 4. Curriculum models and frameworks: An overview of curriculum theory, models and frameworks
- 5. Outcomes, objectives and learning intentions: Approaches to purposeful curriculum design
- 6. School-based curriculum development: Planning and preparing a school's curricula using original or context-specific curricula and commercial curricula
- 7. Collaborative practices in curriculum development: Approaches to collaborative team work by teachers for curriculum development
- 8. Christian teachers as curriculum developers: Summary, and significance of curriculum development to the classroom practice of Christian teachers
