- 4. Appraise various strategies for nurturing stakeholder relationships in Christian schools;
- 5. Develop a Christian perspective on relationships between teachers and other stakeholders;

- 6. Synthesise insights from the literature to propose improvements in ONE stakeholder relationship.
- 7. Critically appraise and analyse the complexities involved in the operation of a faith-based school within a secular social context.

- 2. Community, individualism, and the concept of office
- 3. Master teachers, collaborative instruction, and the power of teams
- 4. Teachers and the parent community
- 5. Students as educational stakeholders
- 6. Influence of diversity in learning communities
- 7. Schools in the wider community
- 8. Responsive discipleship
